Face mask usage in council facilities

Councils are advised that the requirement for mask use in <u>Greater Sydney</u> only applies to businesses and areas listed in the <u>Mandatory Face Coverings Public</u> <u>Health Order</u>.



This includes shopping (retail, supermarkets and shopping centres), public/shared transport, places of worship, and indoor entertainment (including cinemas and theatres).

NSW Health has confirmed that usage of face masks are not mandatory in council facilities such as libraries, museums, child care centres, and art galleries. NSW Health strongly recommends that people who cannot maintain a distance of 1.5 metres or anyone who is front facing with the public should be wearing a mask.

NSW Health has provided <u>updated information and FAQs</u> on wearing a face mask in Greater Sydney, including when you need to wear a face mask, when

you can remove it, and who is exempt.
